In following its commitment to provide an outstanding procurement service to the energy, industrial and shipping sectors the company have recognised the importance of its environmental responsibilities.


Consequently the company have produced this policy statement to act as a framework for developing objectives and targets in an effort to focus its intention of continuous sustainable environmental improvement.

This policy has the approval and commitment of the Managing Director and Board of Directors and its implementation is the responsibility of all staff whose efforts will be co-ordinated by the Environmental Co-ordinator as the designated Environmental Management representative for the company.

CIS will:

- a) Place the minimisation of corporate environmental impacts as a recognised and fully understood corporate priority.
- b) Fully understand the requirements of all applicable environmental legislation and with other requirements to which the company subscribes which relate to its environmental aspects. Where appropriate meet or exceed the requirements of such applicable legislation and requirements. This will also include conformance to any adopted codes of practice which may act as guidance in terms of best practice.
- c) Promote the adoption of energy efficient methods in undertaking its business activities.
- d) Reduce the impact of transport operations.
- e) Ensure the adoption and management of the company's environmental procurement policy with the intent of minimising related environmental impacts.
- f) Provide the necessary training and motivation for employees, to allow a full understanding of the company's environmental policy and ensure that they can contribute to its implementation.
- g) Encourage the development of an environmentally responsible attitude by contractors, sub contractors, temporary staff, remote workers, suppliers and customers.
- h) Where significant hazards are identified, develop and maintain a plan and procedures for emergency preparedness.
- i) Monitor and reduce the waste generated by the company, promote recycling and reuse or disposal with minimal environmental impact. Generally recognise the need to prevent pollution in all its undertakings.

- j) Develop an environmental management system to manage the company's environmental activities and conduct regular environmental audits to assess compliance and identify areas for continual improvement.
- k) Adopt an attitude of openness towards staff and other stakeholders, informing them of the company's environmental policy and recognising any legitimate concerns they may wish to express about the company's position on environmental matters.

CRAIG INTERNATIONAL SUPPLIES SIGNIFICANT ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS

The significant environmental effects of the company have been identified as follows:

WASTE

The bulk of the waste products generated by the company are cardboard, polythene (relating to packaging) and damaged products stored or received by the company. At present the company re-use suppliers packaging for onward deliveries and storage. The company will investigate the feasibility and benefits of greater waste segregation with the view to increasing current levels of recycling and reducing the volume of waste going to landfill.

ENERGY

The main uses of energy are electricity and vehicle fuel. Electricity use includes lighting, battery charging, office and cleaning equipment. The company is committed to produce a full energy management report based on their current facilities and operations, which will contain recommendations for further energy efficiencies. This will be further augmented by an energy audit to quantify current energy spend and potential savings.

TRANSPORTATION

The company makes significant use of transportation in terms of their own delivery vehicles, supplier deliveries and staff travel. It is recognised that this results in harmful emissions to the atmosphere in terms of CO₂, CO, other Hydrocarbons, NO_x and particulates. Consideration will be given to driver training regarding fuel economy, the use of vehicle speed limiters and staff awareness of greener mobility.

PURCHASING

As a wholesaler/supply house the company undertake the purchase of a diverse and extensive range of products, which will have a wide variation of potential environmental impacts. The selection of these products will be undertaken in accordance with the company's Environmental Procurement policy.
